Leadership Advancement Program for Student Organizations (LAPSO) Award Scheme Guidelines

1. Introduction

The award scheme aims to recognize and celebrate student organizations that demonstrate outstanding management, creativity, innovation, and a positive impact on the university or the community.

2. Eligibility

Registered student organizations, i.e. SU, SU-affiliated Societies, Department-Associated Groups

3. Awards

Applicants will be shortlisted based on the application form and supplementary materials submitted, and the LAPSO participation points (for Outstanding Student Organization applications). Shortlisted applicants will be invited to give a presentation and answer questions.

To ensure fairness for all applicants, any modification or submission of supplementary information after the deadline will not be accepted.

I. The Outstanding Student Organization

Criteria	 a. Participation Points (30%) One exco member attends in one LAPSO program activity will receive 1 point. Maximum 30 points. b. Application Documents and In-Person Presentation (70%) The Selection Committee will assess mainly but not limited to the following aspects: Good Management & Communication (15%): The society/group should solicit and manage their funding, time, and other resources effectively, like having clear communication channels and processes, being organized and efficient in activity planning, demonstrating leadership and accountability, etc.; Collaboration & Diversity (15%): The society/group should have worked collaboratively with others, actively seeking out diverse perspectives, embrace diversity and being inclusive and respectful of all members, and fostering a sense of community and belonging; Achievements & Impact (15%): The society/group should strive to make a positive impact in the university community, by engaging in activities that benefit the student population; Creativity & Innovation (15%): The society/group should strive to be creative and innovative in their events and activities, and should try some new ideas and approaches. Others (10%): The society/group should showcase any additional aspects or accomplishments that they believe are important and worthy of recognition.

Criteria	The Selection Committee will assess based on the following aspects: a. Innovation (50%) Whether the activity demonstrates originality and out-of-the-box thinking in one or multiple aspects, including but not limited to activity format, content design, promotion strategy, recruitment, evaluation approach. b. Quality, Impact and Effectiveness (50%) Whether the activity was clearly positioned, well executed, cost-effective, and had achieved its objectives; Whether the activity made an impact, successfully engaged students, the university or community, and/or addressed an important issue or challenge of the university or community; Whether the activity was a collaboration with others, promoted diversity and inclusiveness, or with other achievements.
